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# Introduction

Christian Liberty Press is pleased to make available to students *The Kingdom of God*. The text, by Francis Breisch, Jr., provides high school students with a thorough Old Testament survey course. The books of the Old Testament are analyzed in some detail, and students are provided with thought-provoking questions. We have developed an answer key and test packet to accompany the book. The answer key provides model answers to the Factual Questions found in the textbook.

This test packet includes the following three sections.

- An introduction, including teaching recommendations
- Sixteen tests, each of which covers two or more chapters
- A test answer key found at the end of this test packet

We suggest that teachers read the introductions to the textbook, answer key, and, especially, to this test packet before starting the course. Review the text and become familiar with its format. Instructors should normally expect the student to take an entire school year to complete this course.\* A course schedule may be established which would enable students to take one test every two weeks. Instructors are urged to follow the recommendations found below when teaching the course.

## Recommendations for Parents and Teachers

1. As parent/teacher, you should be ***directly involved*** in teaching and grading this course. Fathers especially have a responsibility to bring up their children “in the discipline and instruction of the LORD” (Ephesians 6:4); we pray that God would use this course in part to “restore the hearts of the fathers to their children and the hearts of the children to their fathers” (Malachi 4:6) in passing on the faith of Jesus Christ to the younger generation.
2. As a Bible course, we encourage the emphasis in study to be on the Bible itself, notably over the portions of Scripture touched on in the course.
3. Your student should do the following in preparation for the tests.
  - Study the relevant textbook chapters for the tests, which are listed at the upper left of each test.
  - Answer all Factual Questions for these chapters.
  - Study all Scripture passages listed in both the Factual and the Thought Questions. Completion of the Thought Questions themselves, however, are optional.
4. In preparation for test two only, have your student become familiar with the Ten Commandments in Exodus chapter 20. Also, the parent’s or teacher’s guidance of the study of the Ten Commandments should give due consideration to the wording found in test two.

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\*This differs from the format used by the Christian Liberty Academy School System (CLASS), which assigns this book over a two-year period.

5. You may tell your student to study the particular chapter(s) of the Bible or textbook covered in the essay exercise as he prepares for the test. Do not, however, allow your student access to the essay question prior to administering the test.
6. Explain to the student that he will be held responsible on the tests for material previously covered in the textbook.
7. Instruct your student to answer the **essay** exercise on the test with the following pointers.
  - Be thorough. Be comprehensive. Cover all the main ideas. Avoid being overly detailed in a minor area while omitting a major one.
  - Be concise. If appropriate, one way is to include a series of items, separated by commas.
  - Answer the question as it stands. Do not give an answer to a similar or related question. Omit irrelevant details.
  - Use complete sentences and correct grammar.
  - Where the essay exercise asks you to relate, discuss, or tell a story or incident, respond in well-developed paragraph form.
  - Check your work. Read your response.
8. Use the point value listed for each section in grading your student's tests. You may want to base a small portion of each test essay grade, not more than a few points, on neatness, grammar, and spelling.
9. **Personally monitor** your student when he is taking a test. Do not allow your student access to the test prior to administering it. Do not allow your student access to the textbook, a Bible, or the answer key during a test.

Wording in the test key for the short answer (write) and essay exercises should be considered as model answers. The parent should neither require nor expect the student to use identical wording; however, the student should convey the same concepts. Information in the test key for parent-teachers is found in italic print. The student is not required to include Scripture references or quotations in his answers; those provided in the test key are for the instructor's use. Alternative wording to test answers have been included occasionally for purposes of clarification or accommodation of different Bible translations.

May the LORD grant your student a richer understanding of the Old Testament and a closer walk with God, in part as a result of work done in *The Kingdom of God* course.
